


Our Mission...

Cultural Celebrations

Join us as we celebrate all the different cultural and religious holidays that happen during the calendar year!

November 14: Diwali,[DQ1] the Hindu, Jain and Sikh 5 Day Festival of Lights, celebrates new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil and lightness over darkness.

November 20: Transgender Day of Remembrance, established in 1998 to memorialize those who have been killed as a result of transphobia and to raise awareness of the continued violence endured by the transgender community.

November 22: Feast of Christ the King, a Catholic holiday established in thanking God for the gift of time and a rededication to the Christian faith.

November 25-January 6: Nativity Fast, a period of abstinence and penance practiced by the Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox and Eastern Catholic churches in preparation for the Nativity of Jesus.

Dr. Stefan Ruhl, professor in the Department of Oral Biology was selected as one of UB's exceptional teachers and researchers to have been named a recipient of the university's 2020 Exceptional Scholar and Teaching Innovation Awards.

Each year, the University at Buffalo honors exceptional scholars and innovative teachers. Stefan Ruhl, professor in the Department of Oral Biology was selected as one of UB's best and brightest teachers and researchers to have been named a recipient of the university's 2020 Exceptional Scholar and Teaching Innovation Awards.

The Exceptional Scholars Award honors faculty members for their outstanding research performance at different stages of their careers. There are two awards: Sustained Achievement Awards for senior scholars and Young Investigator Awards for untenured scholars who received their terminal degree within the past eight years. Both awards recognize work that has "garnered public and/or professional accolades beyond the norm."

Dr. Ruhl received the Sustained Achievement Award. The Sustained Achievement awardees are selected based on their body of work over a number of years. The award is a recognition for outstanding performance in a recent segment of a scholar's career.

As an internationally renowned expert on saliva, oral bacteria and the oral microbiome, Dr. Ruhl's research attempts to unravel the roles that saliva and microorganisms play in health. This includes adhesion to the teeth and surfaces of the mouth, defense against pathogens and colonization of the oral cavity.

Before joining UB School of Dental Medicine, I practiced as a general dentist in a city named Surat. Surat is situated in western India in the state of Gujarat. Surat is famous as the Diamond City, because 90% of world's diamonds are finished and polished in Surat.

Also, known as the Silk city, is the largest manufacturer of silk clothes in India. Every year there is a production of 9 million meters of fabric.

People of Surat are called "Surati." Suratis are known for their generosity. One of the example is Mr Savjibhai Dholakia, a diamond businessman, who gifted 600 cars to his employees during the festival of Diwali in 2018. See photo one below.

Surati food is also very delicious. To name few dishes are Khaman, Dhokla, Undhiyu, Ghari(Sweet) and LOCHO-it is only found is Surat. See photo two below.

What Diwali means to you and how do you celebrate it?

This year on November 14th, a 5 day festival, Diwali or "The Festival of Light" will be held. One of the most popular festivals of Hinduism, Diwali symbolizes the spiritual "victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance".

The festival is widely associated with Lakshmi, goddess of prosperity. Usually it will be a break in school. During Diwali time all family members, cousins visit each other's house to greet "Happy Diwali". All of the community will share gifts, sweets and wear traditional dresses.

There is a special floor painting in front of the door- called "Rangoli". "painted" using colored rice, lentils, flower petals or powder which add on the decoration to the house. See photo three.

People go to temple to see the spectacular arrangement of different sweets and fruits offers to Lord. It is called "Annkoot" After Diwali all sweets are distributed amongst devotees.

I am very happy to share this information with my UB Family. We are a very diverse family here at UB. So many things to learn and know from different cultures. I am so proud to be selected as a student here at UB. I wish I could contribute my knowledge about meditation to everyone which helped me in every stage of life to stay calm and stable.


These stories can be from experiences at school or outside of school.
