

SDM's Dr. Alfredo Aguirre Appointed President of American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology

After serving for six years as one of the Directors of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology (ABOMP), on October 9, 2021, Dr. Alfredo Aguirre became its President. This is a leadership position with significant responsibilities that impact the discipline of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. The ABOMP endeavors to represent the interest of oral and maxillofacial pathologists within the profession itself, in the dental and medical community, and to the public at large. The ABOMP is charged with maintaining the highest standards of practice by annually offering initial and maintenance certifications to Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologists in the US and Canada.

Dr. Aguirre is a Professor in the Oral Diagnostic Sciences Department at the University at Buffalo. He has been the Director of its Advanced Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology program for the last 26 years. As of this year, he has trained 30 individuals, most of them certified by the ABOMP, who are currently engaged in academic activities throughout the world. Dr. Aguirre has published over 90 papers in prestigious peer reviewed, national, and international journals. His research interests have focused on salivary gland secretions, salivary gland tumors and chronic ulcerative-immune-mediated diseases affecting the oral cavity.

In addition, he has been the Manager and moderator of BBOP (Bulletin Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology) since 1994. BBOP is a world wide web-based platform with more than 800 subscribers from more than 36 countries around the world. This platform is the premier forum for the interchange of ideas, discussion of topics and announcements concerning Oral Pathology service, research, and teaching.

This year, he will work in harmony with the Directors of the ABOMP to ensure that Oral and Maxillofacial

Pathology continues to advance amidst this turbulent and uncertain time. He is proud to be a faculty member at UB and continuously strives to bring our Institution to the forefront and at the highest academic spheres possible.

Last year VIVE served more than 2,000 refugees, 60% of whom were women and children.

The event showcased dental students, faculty and staff participating in games, walking the runway and playing music. Art was also displayed at the venue. Proceeds from the event of approximately \$2,000 will benefit the shelter.
