Dr. John H. Campbell Receives 2021 William J. Gies Award in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

Recently, SDM's John H. (Jack) Campbell, DDS, MS, FACS received the 2021 William J. Gies Award. Dr. Campbell was presented the award at the 103rd American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons annual meeting held in Nashville, Tennessee.

Dr. Campbell has served on faculty at several top research universities. As associate professor and former residency program director at the University at Buffalo, he has executed a didactic broad-scope curriculum and shifted the program for more robust scholarly activities. He has implemented journal clubs, a morbidity

and mortality conference and multidisciplenary head and neck tumor boards. He also has guided residents to pursue postgraduate fellowship, mentored students in research and founded a predoctoral minors program engaging students to pursue an OMS career.

Dr. Campbell has served as a CODA site visitor, participated in more than 15 funded research projects and twice received the OMS Foundation's Research Support Grant. An author of over 60 publications, he has been an ad hoc journal reviewer and JOMS Dentoalveolar Surgery Section editor.
