In May, the University at Buffalo hosted a Latvian delegation from Riga. The visit was organized by the University at Buffalo's long standing partner, the Riga Business School, a unit of Riga Technical University and John Wood, Senior Associate Vice Provost for International Education, University at Buffalo.

Part of the delegation was here to visit the current/ongoing program in School of Engineering and Applied Sciences in which faculty from Riga are doing a professional development program to prepare to teach a new program in Computer Science back home.

In addition, there were deans from Riga Stradins University, and the medical university in Latvia, to learn more about curricula and teaching in both the School of Dental Medicine and Jacobs School of Medicine and

Biomedical Sciences.

A third purpose of the delegation's visit was to learn more about high school preparation for higher education in the US and about K-16 pipelines—this relates to educational reforms currently happening in Latvia.

Mirdza Neiders, SUNY Distinguished Teaching Professor, who is originally from Latvia, acted as a liaison with the delegation and our school.
